From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear friends and families of Audubon United Methodist Church, I hope and pray that you and your loved ones are well in these very challenging days. Having restraints over our normal daily lives makes us frustrated. I give thanks to God more now for the freedom I used to take for granted such as eating out, picking up a cup of Dunkin coffee on a way to a meeting, and going to a gym etc. Our normal daily lives seem to be out of balance. We hope to find comfort in the weekly worshipping together and the fellowship. Unfortunately, that must also be put on hold for the safety of all of us and of the surrounding community. The president and governor have issued a directive that there are to be no gatherings of more than 10 people. We are to follow the directives of federal, state and local municipalities. Audubon United Methodist Church will remain closed to all public until further notice immediately. In other words, we will not hold worship service on Sunday at church. However, it is truly important for us to stay connected as a community of believers. Audubon United Methodist Church will be offering worship service online and other programs for our congregation and the surrounding community.

You can also choose to give through your credit card or through your bank account. Simply follow the prompts.

Joel and Alex Aponte and David and Kathy Mannon are adjusting their evangelistic efforts as N.J. college students find their on-campus

studies interrupted by the virus precautions taking place.

To thwart the growth of the virus, many companies are encouraging workers who can work on-line from home to do so. School districts have closed for weeks and many businesses are struggling to survive this financial upheaval of 2020. The sports and entertainment industries have shut down for an unknown period of time. Just as an engine can have a "governor" to limit speeds, our lifestyles are being throttled down due to various quarantines and restrictions by our human governors.

This pandemic may offer you opportunities to really be with friends and relatives like never before, due to the forced slow living. <u>Virtua Health System is recruiting</u> volunteers to serve as chaplain aides

throughout their system in Camden and Burlington Counties. Following a training and orientation period, volunteers are assigned to a specific hospital where thy will visit patients, offering friendship and spiritual support. Virtua has reached out to Audubon UMC to see if anyone would be interested in training to be a chaplain aide. There are openings every day of the week and volunteers are asked to donate 2 to 4 hours each week. The two day training course is offered several times a year, and are being offered on Monday, April27th and May 4th; Monday, June 8th and 22nd; and Thursday, October 29th and 30th. A Note from Anne Simpson to parents and children.

During these difficult times it's important for children to continue learning about God, even though we do not have Sunday school.

Here are some suggestions for 10 minute activities. Resurrection eggs

Resurrection eggs

If you have plastic eggs, great, but if not use small sandwich or snack bags. Number them 1-12. Fill them with symbols that represent the story of Holy Week. Older children can help with ideas for filling eggs. When eggs are full, hide them. After all eggs are found use contents to tell the story of the Resurrection.

- 1. Grey material to represent donkey Jesus rode on Palm Sunday
- 2. A piece of grass to represent palms.
- 3. Finger prints to represent praying hand of Jesus in Garden of Gethsemane
- 4. 3 dimes to represent Judas' payment for his betrayal
- 5. A piece of bread to represent Last Supper
- 6. A piece of soap to represent Pilate washing his hands
- 7. A thorn or piece of rosebush to represent crown of thorns
- 8. A small nail represents Jesus nailed to the cross
- 9. Purple paper represents torn curtain in temple
- 10. White paper or cloth represents Jesus' grave clothes
- 11. Wax or glue represents sealed tomb
- 12. Empty represents the empty tomb

This can be done over several days

Other activities: read a familiar Bible Story like Noah or Jonah in the whale. Have kids draw pictures or act scenes out.

Parents keep a record of what you do with your children. When they come back to Sunday School I'll have a nice surprise.
