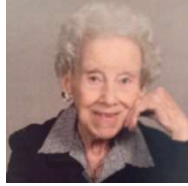

From the Treasurer, William Betts

Carol Tait (Co-Treasurer) and I have been sharing/splitting the responsibilities of the church finances

William – Pays all of the bills, records all deposits and reconciles the bank statements. He also prepares reports for the Finance Committee. In addition he is the contact for Annual Conference and pays our Shared Ministry and Insurance bills monthly, prepares the annual Fund Balance and Workers' Compensation Reports and the financial aspects of the year-end statistical report to Annual Conference. He also contributes to the creation of the annual church budget.

Carol – Takes care of payroll and payroll taxes, Vanco electronic giving and purchases with the church credit card. All invoices and requests for checks and reimbursement should be directed to William at treasurer.Audubonumc@gmail.com.

We both are part of the Finance Committee which is headed by Bob Kondras, Finance Chair.

As you may have noticed, we have two donation categories pertaining to our buildings themselves titled **Repairs & Maintenance and Major Repairs.**

Whether you give with weekly or monthly envelopes, online, or with credit cards, these two categories should show up among the options. It would probably be quite beneficial to elaborate on the difference between the two.

Repairs and Maintenance refers to the regular upkeep work that the buildings require. Bear in mind that we own the church, the church office, the parsonage, associated garages and land. That naturally takes a great deal of resources to maintain. This account handles the non-permanent (i.e. repeatedly necessary over time) work that these facilities require. That could be everything from new lightbulbs to smoke detector batteries. Fortunately, our members are very generous in giving for R&M and understand these vital needs.

Major Repairs refers to "permanent" work to the buildings and land. The term in this case describes an improvement lasting more than a few years. A new roof and the work needed on the bell tower are examples of major repairs.

At this time, the church buildings need several major repairs. The donations we receive greatly favor Repairs & Maintenance rather than Major Repairs, at times almost up to 10 to 1. While we always strive to respect the wishes of donors, this puts the Finance Committee in the uncomfortable position of having to shift funds from R&M to Major Repairs. Given the current needs for several large projects, we beseech everybody giving to those two categories review their donations and adjust the larger

proportion to Major Repairs. This request especially applies to those with automatic online giving set up as they may not review their giving allocation more than once per year.

As always, we have tremendous gratitude for the funding our members provide that enables us to continue the Lord's work in this area. I hope I am able to provide a little more clarity in how our contributions serve His purposes in this community.

Health & Wellness – Short and Sweet

In the fall we will continue with changes in the body as we age. As we enjoy the lovely weather of summer let's focus on summer fun and safety.

July 4th is just around the corner bringing parades, family cookouts and gatherings, and fireworks. Enjoy this time safely. Watch children around the barbecue.
