Each brings expectations that Amadeo, who often solves his problems with a beer in his hand, doesn’t think he can live up to.”

Mission News by Bruce Krout

Why do you get out of bed in the morning?

Prior to a Vision Statement last month, I talked about Perspective cards developed by Barry Warren of CRU in Orlando, Florida. It's a deck of cards used to have spiritual conversations with non-believers in an enjoyable way.

The cards are divided into five topics: Nature of God, Meaning of Life, Human Nature, Identity of Jesus, and Source of Spiritual Truth. Participants choose cards that describe their perspective. Then the second step helps them process the gospel as you listen to their thoughts on Christianity. This activity allows you to identify the different barriers folks have to Christianity. As participants choose their cards within each category there are a couple of follow-up questions available to explore in more detail what their thinking is.

Here are the choices for the topic of Meaning and Purpose of Life:

- *There is none
- *For descendants
- *For love & peace
- *Live for self (be at peace, comfortable, happy, successful)
- *For the afterlife (earn a good afterlife free from suffering)
- *To overcome (addictions, emotional wounds, fears, etc.)
- *Live for others (to serve, care for, teach, encourage, or love others)
- *Live for God (To worship, serve, obey, love, & have a relationship with God)

Each of the five categories has a handful of choices to help the participant to understand what their beliefs are, what their perspective is about their spiritual journey. This activity is fun and non-threatening for the players. Many of the CRU members at Disney use this resource to begin a gospel discussion.

Why don't you download the app from your smartphone or iPad? It's free.

You can find it at the app store by typing "perspective cards". The easy instructions and all of the cards are available for you to share with others. You can learn more by going to YouTube or cru.org and searching "Perspective cards".

So, why do you get out of bed in the morning? Hopefully, you chose "Living for God" when previously reviewing the choices of Meaning and Purpose.

Health & Wellness – Short and Sweet

Over the next few months we will look at how the body changes as we get older, how we can stay healthy as we get older, and how to manage these changes.

We will start with the senses. This month we will look at seeing.

Around age 40 many people find they need reading glasses or bifocals to accommodate both nearsightedness and farsightedness. As we continue to age, glare from bright lights, sunlight, and shiny floors can make it difficult to focus and see things clearly. This can result in falls or other mishaps.

Once we reach those golden years the structures in the eyes change and colors are not perceived as sharply as before. It can be difficult to read signs and dull colors may not even be noticed. For instance, which sign below would you consider to be easier for a senior citizen to see and read?

Background color and lettering can be difficult to even notice if attention is not given to font size, background

color, and the color of lettering. Contrasting colors are much easier to see and read.

Avoid bright glaring lights. Use lamps with shades and window blinds that can filter the direct sunlight.

The Church Council has allocated \$12,000 to technology upgrades. The Finance Committee included \$1,000 for Worship Technology in the original budget which will cover our monthly “Switcher” invoices of \$45 and our annual Zoom cost of approximately \$450.00.


