

Mission News by Bruce Krout

You may remember when Brenda Hallahan (director of Kids Alley) spoke to our congregation a few summers ago and discussed the founder of Kids Alley, Vivian Tan.

Vivian had visited Camden, NJ in 1998 and learned from some of the children that they were unable to play outside in the parks due to the unsafe conditions of used needles on



the ground or potential violence nearby. For years Vivian shared the love of Jesus by driving a trailer every Saturday onto an abandoned lot and entertained the kids by playing music and doing puppetry.

It was 23 years ago that Tan began her outreach. Today, Kids Alley offers an after-school learning program to assist elementary through 8th grade children. They serve families from Camden and surrounding communities. During the pandemic the program had transitioned to full day learning assistance since most students were having to be educated online. Now they are back to normal and providing support after school at the Martin Luther Lutheran Church located at Rt. 130 and Terrace Ave. in Pennsauken.

Another big part of Kids Alley is the 2-hour Saturday Live program in the morning for the whole family. This Christ centered program includes Bible lessons, discussions, and games for all age groups. Breakfast is provided along with a take home bag lunch. There is also a 5-week summer camp offered each year. Kids Alley is such a wonderful and unique program!

You have supported Kids Alley for years now through Mission financing and through your school supply donations each August. Because the C.U.M.I. organization no longer exists due to the pandemic, we are going to pivot and offer our annual **Thanksgiving Ingathering** to Kids Alley families. We are going to support 10 needy families with turkeys and fresh fruits and veggies.

If you would like to support our Christ-loving neighbors this Thanksgiving, please drop off **fresh** carrots, potatoes, apples, pears, and frozen turkeys on Sunday, **November 14th or 21st**. Your monetary donations will be used at a neighboring produce market and the turkeys picked up at the supermarket. Sharing God's word and love, however <u>we can</u>, is our mission.

"Faithful Stewards of God's Infinite Grace"

"Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received" (1

Peter 4:10).

In our last article as part of this year's stewardship emphasis, we saw that God is the owner of everything and that we are managers and stewards of what God has given us. We



considered how each of us has been given gifts of time and talents as blessings of God's grace. We also learned about the importance of using these gifts for God's glory, for the good of others, and for the ministry here at Audubon United Methodist Church.

In addition to time and talents, God has also given us financial resources. For most of us, this means working to secure monetary gain. But make no mistake about it: According to Deuteronomy chapter 8, God gives us the ability to earn money. According to King Solomon, even work itself it is a gift from God (Eccl. 5:19). In fact, everything we have — even the air we breathe in order to be able to work — is a gift that has been temporarily loaned to us by God.

The truth of the temporary status of our financial resources was brought home to a pastor who needed a dark suit to conduct a funeral. He had very little money, so he went to a local pawn shop where he found a like-new suit in just the right size at a very inexpensive price. As he paid for the suit, he asked the clerk how the pawn shop could afford to sell the suit at such a low price. The clerk smiled and admitted that all their suits had once been owned by a local mortuary that had gone out of business.

The minister felt a little strange wearing a suit that had once been part of a funeral home's inventory, but he quickly set aside his apprehension since the price was so low and since no one would know. Everything was fine until in the middle of the funeral service, he casually started to put his hand into the pocket of the pants — only to discover there were no pockets! What an object lesson he received that day as he preached about the importance of living in the light of eternity while wearing a pair of pants without pockets!

All of us know the old saying, "You can't take it with you." That's why whatever we are going to do with the financial resources God has entrusted to us has to be done in this life. In fact, whatever we intend to do for the Lord with our money, we need to be doing now. Or as one person observed, "Do your giving while you're living so you'll be knowing where it's going!"

How we use the money which God has given to us is an indicator of our priorities. Our checkbook and our credit card statements will reveal clearly the things that are really important to us. How we spend our money is, in fact, a barometer of our spiritual temperature and of our personal faith. You see, it doesn't take a lot of faith to make a rational, logical decision concerning our giving. As we review expenses and anticipated income, we can easily find the balance and base our commitment on the numbers alone. But exercising faith, looking to God as our Source to provide above and beyond what we might reasonably be expected to give, well — that's another story.

Jerry Bridges, Vice President of the Navigators, provided this spiritual principle:

When God burdens your heart about something, and you confirm God's leading based on the Scriptures, you can obey, being fully confident that God will provide a blessing, even when circumstances appear contrary.

When it comes to giving, that goes right along with what King Solomon described in Proverbs 11:24-25,

Some give freely yet grow all the richer; others withhold what is due, and only suffer want. A generous person will be enriched, and one who gives water will get water.

Remember, giving is not to help "poor God" pay the bills. Giving is not because God needs anything from us. Giving is God's way of growing Christians. Every time we give for God's glory from hearts that have been redeemed by God's love and grace, we give away a little of our selfishness. Every time we give of our resources that have been loaned to us by God, we grow in grace and in our walk with Christ.

As you consider your life during this time of stewardship emphasis, will you — like the Macedonian Christians — begin by first giving yourself to the Lord? Will you then be one of the "Faithful Stewards of God's Infinite Grace" who will step out by faith by giving your time, your talents and your treasure to the Lord?

advantage of online giving, Vanco has released a new giving app, **Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement**, that makes it easier for members to give, easier for staff to manage – and will help you tell our church's story. The **GivePlus** App was retired on September 30, 2021.

All logins, donations, and saved billing info will transition over to Vanco Mobile from GivePlus Mobile. You will not have to start from scratch. The first time you are on the site or the app, you will be asked to log in with the password you have always used.

If you are not giving electronically yet, you can check out their website for more information.

<u>Vanco Online</u> is a customizable eGiving and payment tool that provides a seamless checkout process for one-time or recurring donations. You can go online to our website and click on Vanco Online to give.

<u>Vanco Mobile</u> The Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement app can be downloaded from the App Store or Google Play Store. It offers online giving tools for members to give and even set up automatic donations. It will also enable members and visitors to make payments for future church fundraisers.

COVID Update

WHAT ARE WE CONTINUING TO BE TOLD?

If you are unvaccinated or vaccinated always wear a mask and social distance regardless of where you are and with whom.

WHY?

The Delta Variant Is quite contagious and easily passed even to someone who is vaccinated. A vaccinated person may be asymptomatic (not exhibiting symptoms), but can be a carrier and infect others.

WHAT WILL THE FUTURE HOLD?...

BOOSTERS - yes they are HERE! All 3 vaccines have been approved for boosters.

Pfizer and Moderna boosters have been approved for healthcare workers, other essential workers, those over 65, and those under 65 who have serious illnesses or conditioners.

J & J booster has been approved for all ages.



Yes, Influenza season is upon us. Viruses thrive in colder weather. we've seen the increases in



COVID last winter, the Flu will rear its ugly head again.

Influenza vaccination protects against a severe case should one contract it.

It is disturbing that already there is controversy in the news regarding the Flu shot and people not wanting it. Some say they don't need it because they never get the Flu. Others say they are afraid of side effects.

The bottom line is that Flu vaccine is needed to control the spread of the Flu. It is no different than COVID. We saw last winter, and are still seeing, the serge of COVID cases in those refusing to get vaccinated. The same thing can happen without the Flu vaccination. Influenza can cause serious illness and death just as COVID. So please get vour Flu shot!

If you are over 65 ask for the quadrivalent vaccine which is designed to protect against four different flu viruses, including two influenza A viruses and two influenza B.
